



(mini) Podcast Project

Audio Tour of Historic Philadelphia at America's Founding With Teaching American History (TAH)

Task: Explore Teaching American History's [interactive map of historic Philadelphia](#) during the Constitutional Convention. Then, choose one location on the map and create a short podcast episode in the style of an audio tour stop that explains the site's history and its significance to the nation's founding.

Instructions:

1. Explore the [Interactive Map of Historic Philadelphia](#)
2. Choose one location on the map that you believe is the most interesting or significant with regard to the nation's founding & write it in the box below.

Return to the [interactive map](#) & use the information provided along with additional resources (like the internet) to fill in any information gaps that you have about your site.
